Observation

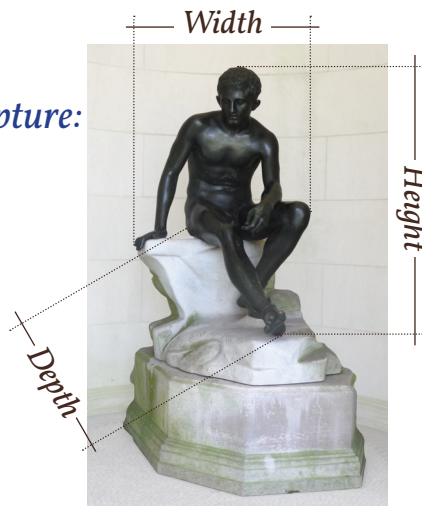
Look carefully at this work of art.
